in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Robert L. Watkins, Jr., his heirs and assigns forever:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, within the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, being shown as portions of Lots 8 and 9 Block B on plat of Property of Chapin Spring Land Company recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book E at Page 41 and also shown as portion 9-A on revised plat by Dalton & Neves dated April 1914 and being described as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake at the southwest corner of Haynie Street and Houston Street and running thence with Houston Street, S. 2-58 W. 118 feet to a stake at the northwest corner of Houston Street and Pearl Avenue; thence with Pearl Avenue, S. 88-44 W. 40.4 feet to a stake at the southern corner of Lots 8-A and 9-A; thence in a northerly direction 118 feet, more or less, in a straight line to a point on the southern side of Haynie Street, which point is S. 89-48 W. 54.5 feet from beginning point; thence with Haynie Street, N. 89-48 E. 54.5 feet to the beginning corner.

On October 19, 1965, said Eloise Sullivan died leaving as her sole heir at law her son, James J. Sullivan, who is over the age of 21 years as of the date of this deed.
