Bruce died testate in Pickens County on March 2, 1953 as will appear by reference to apt. 318, file 23, with certified copies in Greenville County in Apt. 910, File 23, wherein she provided that the residue of her estate, including the above described lot, be divided into three portions, with one portion to be held by James Haygood Bruce and Sydney Bruce as trustees for Frances Brude Bethea and/or her children.
