

accept, make, indorse, discount, or otherwise deal with any bills of exchange, checks, promissory notes, or other commercial or mercantile instruments.

ITEM 4. In general to do all acts, deeds, matters, and things whatsoever in or about my estate, property and affairs, or to concur with persons jointly interested with myself therein in doing all acts, deeds, matters, and things herein, either particularly or generally described, as fully effectually, to all intents and purposes as I could do in my own proper person if personally present.

ITEM 5. And I, the said Melwee Black Littlefield, do hereby ratify and confirm, and promise at all times to ratify and confirm, all and whatsoever my attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done in and about the premises by virtue of these presents, including, anything which shall be done between the revocation of these presents by my death or in any other manner and notice of such revocation reaching my attorney; and I hereby declare that as against me and all persons claiming under me everything which my attorney shall do or cause to be done in pursuance hereof after such revocation as aforesaid shall be valid and effectual in favor of any person claiming benefit thereof who before the doing thereof shall not have had notice of said revocation.
