

I, D. CARL SMITH

OLLIE Francis win the State aforesaid, consideration of the sum of Forty Two Thousand Five Hundred and No/100-2-(\$42,500.00)

to the grantor(s) in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the grantee(s) (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said H. HOKE SMITH, his Heirs and Assigns, Forever:

ALL that parcel or tract of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situate on the northwest side of Pelham Road and on the southeast side of Little Rocky Creek, in Butler Township, in Greenville County, S.C., and shown as the major portion of Tract 1 on a plat of property of T.A. Sizemore, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S.C., in Plat Book E, page 182, and according to a survey made by W.J. Riddle, December 1941, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point in the center of Pelham Road in line of property now or formerly of Tate and Freeland, and runs thence with said Pelham Road N 20-0 E 787.5 feet to a bend in the road; thence still with said Road N 41-05 E 178.9 feet to a point at intersection of Pelham Road and County Road; thence N 49-30 W 1296 feet to stone in line of property now or formerly of J.A. Bull; thence N 49-30 W 881.1 feet to a maple; thence with Little Rocky Creek as the line in a southwesterly direction to line of property now or formerly of Tate; thence with line of last mentioned property S 78-0 E 2670 feet to the beginning corner, and contains 77.21 acres.

This is the same property conveyed to me by deed of J.H. Pike and G.W. Jones, dated February 26, 1946, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S.C., in Deed Book 287, page 441; and is shown on the County Block Book Sheet 533.2, Block 1, as Tract #3.
