1. KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That <u>I</u>, <u>Zelma B</u>. Quinn, <u>Grantor</u>, in consideration of <u>\$1,430.00</u>, paid by <u>Furman University</u>, hereinafter called the Grantee, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant and convey unto the said grantee a right of way in and over my tract of land situate in the above State and County and deed to which is recorded in the office of the RMC of said State and County in Book <u>206</u> at Page <u>52</u>, said lands being described as follows:

ALL that tract of land which originally contained 49.50 acres and was conveyed to the Grantor herein by deed dated September 19, 1938, and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Deed Book 206 at Page 52, and being bounded on the north by lands of Lillie D. Blackwell and May Fenwick; on the west by lands of Ted P. Watson and Creco, Inc.; on the south by lands of J. B. and Evelyn S. Morgan and on the east by the G & N Railroad. The parcel of land affected by this option is shown by the Tax Maps for Greenville County, S. C. on Sheet 429 - Block 1 - Lot 1,

and encroaching on my land a distance of 1,432 feet, more or less, and being that portion of my land 25 feet wide, extending 25 feet from the western edge of the Greenville & Northern Railway right of way as same has been marked out on the ground, and being shown on a print on file in the offices of Furman University.

The Grantor herein by these presents warrants that there are no liens, mortgages, or other encumbrances to a clear title to these lands, and that she is legally qualified and entitled to grant a right of way with respect to the lands described herein.

2. The right of way is to and does convey to the grantee, its successors and assigns the following: The right and privilege of entering the aforesaid strip of land, and to construct, maintain and operate within the limits of same, pipe lines, manholes, and any other adjuncts (Continued on next page)
