

The recital in the deed recorded in Deed Book 16 at page 87 reveals that the said N. Carrie Newton had six brothers and sisters. Reference to the Estate file of W. E. Sullivan recorded in Apt. 187, File 29 in the Office of the Probate Court for Greenville County indicates that in 1924, two of the original brothers had died leaving the five brothers and sisters as follows: George P. Sullivan, A. H. Sullivan, Benjamin M. Sullivan, Carrie Sullivan Newton and Mary D. Royal. In addition, the aforesaid estate file of W. E. Sullivan indicates that Mark D. Sullivan was survived by his widow, Elizabeth N. Sullivan and three children, to wit: Nellie M. Sullivan, Mark D. Sullivan, Jr., and Edgar N. Sullivan. The said A. H. Sullivan subsequently died intestate in Greenville County and there was no administration on his estate. A. H. Sullivan was survived only by his widow, Lula G. Sullivan and one child, Julia S. Holcombe, both of whom conveyed their interest to H. H. Newton by deeds of record in the RMC Office for Greenville County. George P. Sullivan, Benjamin M. Sullivan, and Mary D. Sullivan Royal, all brothers and sisters of N. Carrie Newton, conveyed their interest in the subject property to the said H. H. Newton in various deeds of record. With regard to the interest of Mark D. Sullivan, deceased, there are deeds of record to H. H. Newton from his widow, Mrs. E. N. Sullivan, and two sons, Edgar N. Sullivan and Mark D. Sullivan. The daughter of the late Mark D. Sullivan, Nellie M. Sullivan, died at the age of 16 in or around 1930 without ever having married or had children.
