AMENDMENT TO RIGHT OF WAY AGREEMENT

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA }
 COUNTY OF GREENVILLE } KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That

WHEREAS, by Right of Way Agreement executed by Berry Owens, et al, dated July 15, 1949, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office in and for said County in Book 387, page 117; Ratification Agreement executed by Bertha Louise Wilds dated August 6, 1949, recorded Book 390 at page 91; Ratification Agreement executed by T. H. Owens dated August 13, 1949, recorded Book 390 at page 89; Ratification Agreement executed by Berry Eugene Owens dated November 16, 1949, recorded Book 398 at page 43; and by Order of the Honorable James B. Morrison, Presiding Judge, Thirteenth Judicial Circuit, dated September 10, 1964; (hereinafter referred to as Original Agreement); TRANSCONTINENTAL GAS PIPE LINE CORPORATION (hereinafter called Transcontinental), is the owner of a right of way and easement for pipe line purposes across the lands described therein situated in Greenville County, South Carolina, reference being here made to said Original Agreement and its record for a complete description of the lands involved and all other purposes; and

WHEREAS, Transcontinental has heretofore constructed four pipe lines across said lands in accordance with said Original Agreement and may in the future, from time to time, desire to construct additional pipe lines pursuant thereto, and Lethia Owens Reese, as the present owner of a portion of said lands, (hereinafter called Grantor), has requested Transcontinental to enter into this agreement for the purpose of defining Transcontinental's right of way.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between Transcontinental and Grantor that in so far as the lands presently owned by Grantor are concerned, whether described in said Original Agreement or not, shall be and is hereby amended as follows:

1. Transcontinental's permanent right of way shall be 152 feet in width, the side lines of same being 15 feet southeasterly and 137 feet northwesterly of the most southeasterly of Transcontinental's four presently existing pipe lines, being the 42 inch pipe line constructed in the year 1967. During the original periods of additional pipe line construction and maintenance, Transcontinental shall have the right to clear and use, as temporary work space only, reasonable areas adjoining the said permanent right of way for the purposes of passage of equipment engaged in the construction of such additional pipe line or pipe lines and maintenance of existing pipe lines.

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
