"This is to be used for church purposes and school or parsonage and if church or school should not be kept on this, then it is to fall back to the original tract." and

WHEREAS, said W. B. Charles died leaving the following descendants:
Thomas K. Charles, son; Annie Pearl Charles Walker, daughter; Paul Charles, son
and Maude Charles, daughter; and

WHEREAS, said Thomas K. Charles died in 1953 leaving the following descendants: Mrs. James Puryear, daughter; and Mrs. Grace Charles Dollmeyer, and WHEREAS, said Annie Pearl Charles died in 1930 leaving as her descendant, her son, W. Charles Walker, and

WHEREAS, said Paul Charles died in 1956 leaving as his descendant, his daughter, Mrs. Maude Charles Boysworth, and

WHEREAS, said Maude Charles died in 1958 leaving no descendants, and WHEREAS, said Mrs. James Puryear, Mrs. Grace Charles Dollmever, William Charles Walker, and Mrs. Maude Charles Boysworth are the only persons who could have an interest in the aforesaid property if said Flat Rock Church should not be kept on the property.
