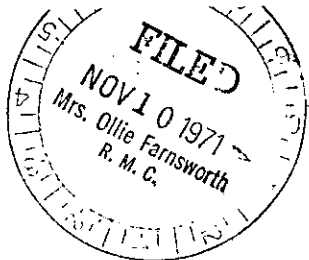

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that I, JOHN H. THOMASON, of Richmond County, Georgia, in consideration of the love and affection which I have for my mother, Fannie Mae Thomason, of Greenville County, South Carolina, and the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00), cash to me in hand paid before the signing and delivery of these presents, receipt whereof is now acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and do, by these presents, grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said FANNIE MAE THOMASON, the following described property, to-wit:

ALL that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, about four (4) miles Northwest of the City of Greenville, and being on the Northwest side of the Motor Boat Road, formerly known as the Gibbon Road, and being more particularly described, according to survey and plat by J. C. Hill, dated April 27, 1956, as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on the Northwest side of said Road, and running thence North fifty-five degrees West one hundred seventy-seven and three-tenths (177.3) feet to an iron pin, which iron pin is thirty-four and nine-tenths (34.9) feet Southwest from the original Northwest corner of tract of Jessie L. Reid; thence South twenty-seven degrees five minutes West one hundred forty-seven and two-tenths (147.2) feet to an iron pin; thence South forty-eight degrees twenty minutes East one hundred thirty-six and four-tenths (136.4) feet to an iron pin on said Road; thence
