ALL that parcel or strip of land situate on the South side of First Street and on the North side of Fourth Street in the Simpsonville Mill Village in the Town of Simpsonville, Greenville County, South Carolina, and having, according to a survey of Woodside Mills made by Piedmont Engineering Service in February, 1953 recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book GG, Page 5, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
