1. RULES GOVERNING CEMETERY LOT OWNERSHIP. Lots purchased in Greekland Cemetery are

conveyed by Warranty Deed to the purchaser for his only and heirs, as a burial place forever.

In order that the Corporation may have a correct record of ownership of all lots where a re-sale and conveyance is made, it is required that the recorded deed be presented at our office so that a record of the transfer can be made. A fee of \$2.00 will be collected before any transfer of ownership is made on the Corporate records. The Corporation is governed by its own bylaws concerning transfers of lots.

Where a lot is purchased and an extension of time is granted by the Corporation for payment the Corporation retains ownership of the lot until all charges due it are paid and the Corporation reserves the right to remove what remains which may be offered on the lot, to a smaller lot equal in value to the amount paid on the same, or to a single grave in the event that a default

An order in writing is required of the lot owner or his heirs whenever a grave is to be opened, containing the name, age, sex and residence of the deceased, and a permit from the Board of Health must be shown. The Superintendant of the grounds before interment is made. If interment is to be made before 5 o'clock p.m. on the previous

Lot owners shall at once notify the Corporation of any change in his or her post office address or name. No disentitlement shall be allowed except upon order of the Executive Officers of the Corporation and upon written order of the owner or owners of the lot, and

In every case criminal may be made under the supervision of
the Superintendent. The Coroner shall have the right at all times to
enter upon such and every lot for the purpose of num-
bering, cleaning, and policing it.
The Corporation from time to time may lay out or
arrange such avenues or walks, or make such rules and reg-
ulations for the government of the grounds as it may

No consent or approval of the Corporation shall be given or binding unless the same shall be in writing over the signature of an Executive officer.

ARTICLE VI. GOVERNING WORK DONE AT CEMETERIES. All orders for work to be done at the Cemetery, or any part thereof, shall be left with the Superintendent who is located on the Cemetery property. No employees are forbidden to accept orders for work and are not allowed to accept fees, payments, or any sort, or compensation, from persons for services rendered.

No lot owner shall have the right to have shrubs and plants cultivated in any portion of the lot, except upon permission of the Corporation. In the event permission is granted, all work to be done under the direction of the Superintendent and to be paid for in cash before work is done. If any shrubs, plants or trees situated in any lot become a public or inconveniences, or interfere with the proper use of the cemetery, the Corporation, by its authorized representatives or employees, shall have the right to enter a said lot and remove the said trees or shrubs or such parts thereof as they shall determine to be detrimental, unattractive, or inconvenient. No owner shall be permitted

4. BUTLER GOVERNING MONUMENTS AND POWERS.
Such public monuments shall be erected in that part of the Corporation and only, where required for names of persons entitled to them.

entitlement from the duly authorized officers of the Corporation. A duly made bond with the Corporation, in the sum of one thousand dollars, shall be given by each member of the Board of Directors, and by each member of the Board of Managers, and by each member of the Board of Trustees, and by each member of the Board of Auditors, before he or she shall be admitted to the Board. All foundations for monumens, etc., to be laid by the same, shall be submitted to the Board of Directors, and shall be voted upon by the Board, and if approved, the same may be erected. All work in the building of the foundation shall be done by the members of the organization, and under the direction of the superintendents, and no trustee, or any other person, shall be allowed to interfere with the work.

At all points where the base of a column is to be built in each State, a marker or marker and post shall be placed above ground level, except when the stone is mounted by the contractor, and then, only in the event that it is considered necessary by the architect or engineer.

No work of any character will be done upon any lot adjacent to cemetery employees or by some person authorized in its behalf, and no lawns, trees, shrubbery, structures, improvements, enclosures, or excavations shall be made or placed in or upon any lot without the consent of the Corporation.

placed or kept upon any lot or ground except by the cemetery employees as directed by the Superintendent.

The grade of all lots, lawns, and avenues as established or changed, from time to time, by the cemetery and all improvements put or placed upon any lot shall not be altered or changed except by the cemetery.

No trees, shrubbery, or plants shall be placed upon or removed from any lot or ground, except with the consent

(b) The Corporation, but the Corporation shall have the right, from time to time, to plant, transplant, remove, or eliminate trees, shrubs and plants upon said lots.

(c) The Corporation reserves to itself the entire control of every tree, shrub or vine, growing within the cemetery or grounds, including the right of removal when it becomes necessary, and reserves such removal and sale.

Trees will not be removed to make additional burial space. The Corporation will use reasonable care in examining trees and removing those apparently in unsound and dangerous condition or unsound and dangerous limbs and branches of trees, but it expressly disclaims responsibility for damage, either to

No flowers or ornaments or objects shall be kept upon my lot, & if the same shall have become withered, soiled, or unsightly, and in case of the failure of the owner of my lot to remove any such flowers or other unsightly objects, the Corporation shall have the right to remove the same and in no case will the employees attempt to do so.

and then after removal, nor will the Corporation be responsible for anything placed on lots or graves. No baskets, glass, crockery, wire, metal arches, water-pots, glass rae, covering, box containing artificial flowers, or any sort of receptacle for flowers, except such as are sunk below the surface of the lawn for the grave lot, shall be permitted.

3. RULES FOR VISITORS AT THE CEMETERY.
The Cemetery will be open from seven o'clock a. m. to
noontime, five days in the week, and from eight a. m. to
four o'clock p. m. on Saturday.
