EASEMENT

as Hughes Creek Road,

shall be from South Carolina Highway known, which Highway runs through Blue Mountain

Estates, across that property conveyed to her by Victor Lebre on June 16, 1966 and of

record in the R.M.C. office for Greenville County in Deed Book 300, at Page 392. The

actual location to be specified as hereinabove stated at the option of Joseph J. Grooms.

It is expressly understood and agreed that the road as constructed will be not less than 20 feet wide and will be a dirt road properly drained.
