

Being the same property conveyed to J. Bordie Tollison by deed of L. E. Cox dated January 1, 1922 and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 109, at page 321.

J. B. Tollison died intestate in 1944, leaving as his sole heirs at law his widow, Ellen Peden Tollison, and his two daughters, Kathleen T. Ayers and Elizabeth T. Terry.
