proceedings under any law relating to bankruptcy, insolvency, or the reorganization or relief of debtors to be instituted by or against it and, if contested by it, not to be dismissed or stayed within 60 days; or suffer any judgment, writ of attachment or execution or any similar process to be issued or levied against all or a substantial part of its property which is not released, stayed, bonded or vacated within 60 days after its issue or levy;

The foregoing provisions of this Section are subject to the following limitations: If by reason of force majeure the Lessec is unable in whole or in part to carry out the agreements of the Lessee on its part herein contained (other than the obligations on the part of the Lessee contained in Article V and Section 6.3, 6.4 and 8.7 hereof to which this paragraph shall have no application), the Lessee shall not be deemed in default during the continuance of such inability. The term "force majoure" as used herein shall mean, without limitation, the following: acts of God; strikes; lockouts or other industrial disturbances; acts of public enemies; orders of any kind of the government of the United States or of fouth Carolina or any of their departments, agencies, or officials, or any civil or military authority; insurrections; riots, epidemics; landsliden; lightning; carthouale; fire; hurricaren; stomen; floods; vanhouts; aroughts; accounts; restraint of government and people; civil disturbances; emplosions; breakage or accident to maddinery, transmission piper or canals; partial or entire railure of utilities, or any other cause or event not remonday within the control of the house, it being agreed that the settlement of atrikes, lockouts, and other industrial disturbane a sholl be entirely within the discretion of the sessee, and the hosses shall not be required to hate settlement of striker, lockouts and other incustrict disturbances to accoding to the depends of the opposing party or particle when such commoning in
