CALL TO ORDER

The December meeting of the South Carolina American Revolution Bicentennial Commission was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Chairman Morrah.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Chairman Morrah requested the pleasure of the Commission concerning the minutes. Upon a motion by Colonel Anger, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously approved, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

MEDALLION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Medallion Committee, consisting of Colonel Anger, Representative Manning, and Mr. Lee, recommended that the Commission arrange to sell only the official South Carolina silver medallion, designed by Mr. James Haysworth and produced by the Franklin Mint of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Mr. Lee said the mint will sell the medallions to the Commission for \$5.75 each for an order of 2,500 medallions. Individual plastic covers for each medallion can be purchased for four to five cents each.

The members discussed a resale price for the medallions and determined that most other states were pricing them at \$12.50 or \$12.75 each.

Staff members informed the Commission that the banks of the state would assist with the sale of the official medallion, on a voluntary basis.
