WHEREAS, his wife, Pearl L. Coleman, predeceased the testator, having died on October 28, 1968, and

WHEREAS, Eddie Eugene Coleman, a child of James E. Coleman, died testate on November 30, 1973, as will be shown by Greenville County Probate Court, Apartment 1309, File 4, in which he devised his estate to his wife, Evelyn Louise Coleman, and

WHEREAS, the remaining children of James E. Coleman and the beneficiary of Eddie Eugene Coleman are desirous of effecting a division of the property of James E. Coleman as provided in his Will,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That we, Annie Ruth Coleman, Flora Beatrice Coleman and Ethel Coleman Owens

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of - - - - -

- ONE AND NO/100 (\$1.00) DOLLAR and division of property- - - - - Dollars

to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by

Evelyn Louise Coleman

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Evelyn Louise Coleman and her heirs and assigns forever:

All that lot of land located in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Oneal Township, about eight miles northwest of Greer, on the southeast side of Darby Road, containing 6.4 acres, more or less, as shown on a survey entitled "Property of James E. Coleman Estate" dated December 12, 1974, by W. R. Williams, Jr., Surveyor, to be recorded herewith, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a nail and cap in the center of Darby Road (iron pin back at 25 feet), joint front corner with property being conveyed to Ethel Coleman Owens, and running thence S. 38-27 E. 1023.9 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 58-18 W. 303 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 36-56 W. 660.9 feet to a nail and cap in center of Darby Road (iron pin back at 20 feet); thence with center of Darby Road as line N. 37-28 E. 187.1 feet to a nail and cap; thence N. 35-58 E. 100 feet to the point of beginning.
