WHEREAS, the United States of America, for and on behalf of its agency, the Farmers Home Administration, on or about the 21st day of October, 1974, did file its complaint in the District Court of the United States for the District of South Carolina against Richard Thompson, following which the matter came before the Honorable Robert W. Hemphill, United States District Judge, who, after full consideration thereof, and mature deliberation in the premises did order, adjudge and decree that the property described in the complaint, and more particularly hereinafter set forth and described, should be sold by the United States Marshal for the District of South Carolina on the terms and conditions and for the purposes set out in the Decree of Foreclosure and Sale filed on November 18, 1974 in the case, assigned civil action number 74-1554, all of which will more fully appear by reference to the case file in the said Court; and

WHEREAS, on the 30th day of January, 1975, the Honorable Robert W. Hemphill, United States District Judge, did confirm the said sale and direct that the United States Marshal make title to said estate to the said purchaser; and
