in the State aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said JOHN BOLT CULBERTSON, his Heirs and Assigns:

Three (3) gravesites in Greenville County, South Carolina, being three (3) of the gravesites of Lot No. 65, Section N, of Springwood Cemetery, having the following dimensions, to wit: N-11', E-16', S-11', and W-16'

for the right of burial and cemetery purposes, and to be used exclusively for the right and purpose aforesaid, and subject to the conditions of the Charter of The City Council of Greenville, and all revisions thereof and amendments that may be made thereto, and also subject to the Ordinances of said City and the rules, regulations and by-laws of the City Council and cemetery Trustees or Committee, now in force, or which may hereafter be passed, relating to said cemetery and the burial of the dead therein.

Being a portion of the cemetery lots conveyed to J. O. Sloman, Sr., by The City Council of Greenville by deed dated 25 June 1926.
