Carolina, its successors and assigns forever, in trust nevertheless for the purposes and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth. And the grantor does hereby bind the grantor and the grantor's heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular said premises unto the Trustee and the Trustee's successors and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

The Trustee shall hold, administer, invest and reinvest the above described property (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the trust property), shall collect the income therefrom and shall pay and distribute the net income therefrom in convenient installments, not less than annually, in equal shares to the grantor's nieces, Susan Carr Pickett and Margaret Carr Grant, for the remainder of their lifetimes (unless the trust is sooner terminated as hereinafter provided) and upon the death of either of the grantor's said nieces, such deceased niece's share of the net income shall be paid to such niece's children who shall be living at the time of each payment and if there are no children of said deceased niece then living, then such share of the net income shall be paid to the grantor's surviving niece. Upon the death of the survivor of the grantor's two said nieces, this trust shall terminate and the trust property as then constituted together with any undistributed net income shall be conveyed and paid over in equal parts per stirpes to the then living children of the said Susan Carr Pickett and Margaret Carr Grant. If there are no then living children of either of the grantor's two said nieces, the said property shall be paid over to the persons who would then be the grantor's heirs, their identities and respective shares to be determined as though the grantor had then died intestate according to the laws of the State of South Carolina then in effect.
