IT IS my intention that this Power of Attorney shall continue in effect notwithstanding my incapacity or incompetenece, and I do hereby specifically declare "this Power of Attorney shall not be affected by physical disability or mental incompetence of the principal which renders the principal incapable of managing his own estate." I hereby relieve my attorney-in-fact of the responsibility and duty of filing reports with any courts.

PARKER shall predecease me or for any reason shall fail to serve as my attorney-in-fact (or having begun serving, shall cease to serve) then in such event I make, constitute and appoint KAREN PARKER MURPHY my true and lawful attorney-in-fact with all rights, powers and duties as set forth herein.

AND for the protection of all parties dealing with my said attorney-in-fact, I do hereby agree that the Power of Attorney shall be and remain in full force and effect until revoked by me in writing, which revocation shall be recorded in the Office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance for Greenville County, State of South Carolina.
