

or Administrator of the Settlor's estate. Written statements by the Executor or Administrator of such sums due and payable by the estate shall be sufficient evidence of their amount and propriety for the protection of the Trustee and the Trustee shall be under no duty to see to the application of any such payments. The Trustee shall pay over to the Executor of the Settlor's estate all obligations of the United States Government held hereunder which may be redeemed at par in payment of federal estate taxes.

ARTICLE V: Upon the death of the Settlor and after making payment of funeral expenses and claims against the Settlor or her estate and any other payments provided for in the immediately preceding Article, the Trustee shall distribute and dispose of the Trust Estate (which shall include any property which may be added from the Settlor's general estate) as follows:

(1) The Trustee shall convey, transfer and deliver to the Settlor's godchildren, Emily Clark and Judy Clark and their mother, Alice Clark, or to such of them as are then living the Settlor's house and lot at 146 Augusta Court, Greenville, South Carolina and the contents therein consisting of all the Settlor's personal and household effects of every kind including, but not limited to, furniture, appliances, furnishings, pictures, silverware, china, glass, books, jewelry, wearing apparel, and all policies of fire, burglary, property damage and other insurance on or in connection with the use of this property. In the event the said house and lot at 146 Augusta Court has been sold by the Settlor or by the Trustee prior to the death of the Settlor then any portion of the sales proceeds remaining at the death of the Settlor, to the extent such proceeds can then be traced and identified by the Trustee (the determination
