Whereas at a meeting of the session of the First Presbyterian Church of Greenville, S.C., July 28th, 1928, at which meeting a majority of the entire membership of the session were present, a resolution was unanimously adopted authorizing the Finance Committee of the Church to borrow by for the use of the Church the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the Southeastern Life Insurance Company, and authorizing the Board of Trustees to execute a note in the Church as hereinafter described, and in order to secure such note to execute a mortgage carrying the liability hereinafter described, and to execute the attestation of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees of said Church and to affix the seal of the Corporation thereto;

Whereas the said First Presbyterian Church of Greenville, S.C., in and by its certain promissory note in writing of even date with these presents, is well and truly indebted to the Southeastern Life Insurance Company in the full and just sum of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars, to be paid five (5) years after date, with the right to anticipate payment in full or in part at any time with interest thereon from date at the rate of seven (7%) per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid semi-annually until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due,
