sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of *Twenty five* \$25
Dollars besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be
added to the amount due on the said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part
thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference

The interest of Aaron Walker being conveyed to William Cureton by deed dated Nov. 7th, 1896, and recorded in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Book CCC page 604.
