SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, we, the said A. C. Justice and S. L. Jones  
 in and by our certain promissory note, in writing, of  
 even date with these presents, are

Arthur S. Agnew  
 in the full and just sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred and no/100  
 Dollars, to be paid one year after date, it being agreed that one of the notes  
 secured by this mortgage is in the amount of Two Thousand Dollars and the  
 other is in the amount of \$500.00, further that the \$2,000.00 note is a first lien  
 and the \$500.00 note is junior to the \$2,000.00 note; it is further agreed that the \$500.00<sup>note</sup>  
 endorsed note is issued in three notes, one for \$200.00, one for \$200; and one for \$30, all of these being junior to the \$2,000. note

with interest thereon, from October 1, 1929, at the rate of 8% per annum to be  
 computed and paid semi-annually until paid in full all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal and if any portion of principal  
 or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note, to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof who may  
 sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of five per cent above to collect  
 besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on the said note, to be collectible as a part thereof; if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part  
 thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (an which is secured under this mortgage) as in and by the said note, reference being  
 thereto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That we, A. C. Justice and S. L. Jones, do make and enter into this present instrument, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, to the said

Arthur S. Agnew, do make and enter into this present instrument, in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, the said

in hand well and truly paid by the said Arthur S. Agnew, at the day and month and year above written.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents do grant, bar-  
 gain, sell and release unto the said Arthur S. Agnew

All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate  
 in the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid,  
 on the north side of West Washington Street, the south-  
 eastern corner of the Davenport Girls Home property,  
 and running thence along West Washington Street  
 in a westerly direction 77 feet and 8 inches to a point,  
 the corner of the Moore property; thence along Moores  
 line in a northerly direction 180 feet to a point;  
 thence in an easterly direction in a line parallel  
 with John Street 77 feet 8 inches to a point in the  
 line of the Davenport Girls Home property; thence  
 in a southerly direction along line of said  
 Davenport Girls Home property 180 feet to the point  
 of beginning on West Washington Street.
