TO WHOM ALL THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

Whereas, I, J. W. F. Bramlett, SEND GREETING:

in and by my certain promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to A. P. C. Edwards in the full and just sum of Seven Hundred and fifty Dollars to be paid as follows, to-wit: Fifty Dollars on the first day of March A. D. 1938 and fifty dollars each and every consecutive month thereafter thereafter until paid in full.

with interest thereon from date at the rate of 7 1/2 per centum per annum to be computed and paid semi-annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note, after its maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of his interests to place and the holder should place the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses including 10 per cent. of the indebtedness as attorneys' fees, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, that I, J. W. F. Bramlett, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said A. P. C. Edwards

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration to the further sum of Three Dollars, to W. H. Smith, the said J. W. F. Bramlett

in hand well and truly paid by the said A. P. C. Edwards at and before signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by the Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said A. P. C. Edwards, his heirs and assigns,

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, Saluda Township, about two miles south of Locust Hill, adjoining lands of George Gilbreath, Gus Boswell, myself and others, and being a part of the same land conveyed to me by deed from Margaret Ella Parrot Poole, said deed bearing date of Jan. 10th 1939 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in deed book 145 at page 314, and having the following metes and bounds, courses and distances, to-wit:

Beginning on an iron pin in the mush Creek Road George Gilbreath corner and runs thence with the said road N. 10° 10' E. 366.6 feet to bend in road, thence NNE. 00° E. 150 feet to bend; thence N. 5° 20' 300 feet to bend, thence N. 3° 1. 20. 200 feet to bend; thence N. 32° 00' 20. 498.5 feet to bend; thence N. 19° 45' 20. 246 feet to an iron pin in the road that leads by the old Boswell place; thence S. 89° 00' 20. 106.9. 3 feet to an iron pin near a branch; thence N. 100° 20. 257.5 feet to an iron pin near a willow, N. 41°. 30. Boswell's corner; thence with the Boswell line N. 86° 00' 20. 300 feet to an iron pin, N. M.; thence S. 24° 10' E. 1367.5 feet to an iron pin in a settlement road; thence with the said road S. 43° 30' 20. 50 feet to a bend in the S. 24° 30' 20. 134 feet to an iron pin in the said road and on George Gilbreath's line; thence with the said line S. 76° 30' E. 1008 feet to the beginning corner, containing thirtysix and sixtythree (36.63) acres, more or less.
