WHEREAS First party is indebted to the Land Bank Commissioner, acting pursuant to Part 3 of the Act of Congress approved May 12, 1933, known as the Emergency Farm Mortgage Act of 1933, hereinafter called second party, as evidenced by a certain promissory note, of even date herewith, for the principal amount of \$39.00, and interest thereon, payable to the Land Bank Commissioner, at Greenville County and State aforesaid, hereinafter called first party, whether one or more, SEND GREETINGS:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That first party, in consideration of the debt as evidenced by the said note, and for better securing the payment thereof to second party, according to the terms of the said note, and the performance of the conditions and covenants herein contained, and also in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to first party in hand well and truly paid by second party, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, and released, in fee simple, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release in fee simple, unto second party, his successors and assigns, the following described lands, to wit:

affidavit that tract was a parcel of land containing one hundred and six (106) acres in Franklin Township, Greenfield County, South Carolina, known as the Bossett Place, situated on the Holliday Bridge Road about 7 miles from Belton, on waters of Saluda River, bounded on the north by land of W. L. Martin, on the East by lands of W. E. Bossett, J. E. Gadsden, and Mamie Stokes; on the South by lands of W. E. Bossett, J. E. Gadsden, and Mamie Stokes; on the West by lands of Belton Bright and Power Company, and having the following corners: iron pin in Holliday Bridge Road, Oct. 5, 1933, copy of which is now on file with the Federal Land Bank of Columbia:-

Martin corner; thence with Martin line South 11 degrees West 9.10 chains to iron pin; thence still with Martin line South 84 degrees West 13.50 chains to iron pin; thence North 86 degrees West 5.30 chains to iron pin; thence South 82 degrees 45 minutes West 16.07 chains to iron pin on public road; thence with the road North 86 degrees West 11.78 chains to pine; thence South 79 degrees 45 minutes West 10.62 chains to iron pin; thence North 60 degrees 15 minutes West 8.66 chains to poplar; thence North 65 degrees West 1.08 chains to stone; thence South 24 degrees 30 minutes West 3.54 chains to stone; thence South 8 degrees 30 minutes West 3.60 chains to stone; thence South 27 degrees 30 minutes West 5.00 chains to stone; thence South 7 degrees East 5.00 chains to stone; thence South 5.02 chains to stone; thence North 83 degrees 30 minutes East 3.84 chains to stone; thence North 38 degrees 30 minutes East 4.54 chains to stone; thence North 30 degrees 55 minutes East 3.74 chains to stone; thence South 77 degrees 30 minutes East 2.87 chains to stone; thence South 56 degrees West 1.94 chains to stone; thence South 29 degrees 30 minutes West 5.15 chains to stone; thence North 83 degrees 30 minutes East 62.90 chains to stone corner of road; thence with said road North 39 degrees 45 minutes East 11.00 chains to iron pin in Holliday Bridge Road, beginning corner.
