TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

Mr. John Byrd and Emma Byrd, of Greenville, S.C.

SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, we, the said John Byrd and Emma Byrd, in and by our certain promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents, are well and truly indebted to Peoples National Bank of Greenville, South Carolina, in the full and just sum of One Hundred and no/100 (\$100.00) Dollars, to be paid November 1st, 1937,

with interest thereon, from date at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum to be computed and paid on November 1st, 1937,

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of One-half cent

besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on the said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That we, the said John Byrd and Emma Byrd, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Peoples National

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to us, the said

John Byrd and Emma Byrd
in hand well and truly paid by the said Peoples National
Bank of Greenville, S.C.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Peoples National Bank of Greenville, South

Carolina, its successors and assigns.

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in the state of South Carolina, in County of Greenville and in Butler Township, about two and one-half miles east of the City of Greenville, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning on a pine, 3x, and running thence N. 42° 2.68 to a rock, 3x, on road, thence N. 85° E. 1.62 to a rock on same road, thence S. 81 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 5.27 to rock, 3x, on road, thence S. 71° W. 7.61 to the beginning corner, the same containing nine-tenths (9/10) of an acre, more or less.

Also, all that other piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in the same state, County and Township as the above mentioned tract of land and adjoining the above mentioned tract, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a post oak, thence S. 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 8.30 chains to a stone, 3x0 m.; thence S. 21° W. 5.00 to a peach tree, 3x0; thence S. 77° E. 5.95 to a stone, 3x0; thence N. 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 9.26 to the beginning corner containing 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less.

The above two tracts of land are the same conveyed to me by Perry V. Vaughn by his deed dated Feb. 13, 1918 and recorded in Vol. 55 at page 40, R. M. C. office for Greenville County.

Also, all that other piece, parcel or tract of land in said state, county and township, on the headwaters of Richland Creek of Reedy River, adjoining the two tracts of land above mentioned, formerly bounded by L. J. Jennings, James Austin, Phyllis Means and others, but now bounded by Dr. R. E. Harston, Richard Watson, and others. This tract of land contains about four (4) acres, more or less, and includes all the land represented on a Plat made by Wm. A. Hudson, D. S., of date, Dec. 19, 1904, and any other of what is or was known as the Haskworth Poor School which belonged to Janie J. Brock and Mamie Brock in that vicinity, same being acquired by them by descent from E. F. Brock and as his sole, heirs at law and distributees, said E. F. Brock having died intestate, and this tract of land being the same conveyed to me by the said Janie J. Brock and Mamie Brock by their deed dated Dec. 28, 1904 and recorded in Vol. 1000 at page 112, R. M. C. office for Greenville County. This is the first mortgage over the above described properties and there are no other mortgages, liens or other encumbrances over same prior to this mortgage.
