SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS I, the said Mary G. Raby, nee Mary E. Garrison

in and by my certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, OF GREENVILLE, in the full and just sum of  
TWO THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED & NO/100

(\$ 2,400.00) Dollars, with interest at the rate of (6%) per centum per annum, to be repaid in instalments of TWENTY-FOUR AND NO/100 (\$ 24.00) Dollars upon the first
