in and by ~~our~~ certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents are well and truly indebted to

FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, OF GREENVILLE, in the full and just sum of ONE THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED & NO/100

(\$1,200.00) Dollars, with interest at the rate of (6%) per centum per annum, to be repaid in instalments of TWELVE AND NO/100

(\$ 12.00) Dollars upon the first

day of each and every calendar month hereafter in advance, until the full principal sum, with interest has been paid, said monthly payments shall be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on the unpaid balance, and then to the payment of principal; said note further providing that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days, or failure to comply with any of the By-Laws of said Association, or any of the stipulations of this mortgage, the whole amount due under said note, shall, at the option of the holder thereof, become immediately due and to be added to the amount due on said note, and to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That ~~x we~~ the said Louie F. South and Ruth H. South

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, OF GREENVILLE, S. C., according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to ~~us~~ the said Louie F. South and Ruth H. South

in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, OF GREENVILLE, S. C., at and before the signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, OF GREENVILLE, S. C., the following described property to-wit:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville,

Greenville Township, and on the north side of Marion street in the Town of West Greenville, and being known and designated as Lot No. 96 of a subdivision known as "Donwood" as shown on plat thereof recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book A, at page 462, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the north side of Marion street at the joint corner of Lots Nos. 95 and 96, which point is 235 feet west of the northwest corner of the intersection of Woodlawn avenue and Marion street and running thence along the joint line of Lots 95 and 96, N. 15-20 W. 150 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 95, 96, 105 and 106; thence with the rear line of Lot No. 105, S. 75-26 W. 50 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 96, 97, 104 and 105; thence along the joint line of Lots Nos. 96 and 97, S. 15-20 E. 150 feet to the joint corner of said lots on the north side of Marion street; thence along the north side of Marion street, N. 74-26 E. 50 feet to the beginning corner. Being the same lot conveyed to us by Pearl Strickland by deed dated June 13, 1944 and not yet recorded."

The Marion street referred to herein is also referred to as Green street.
