NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee pursuant to the covenants herein and also in consideration of the further sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, his heirs, successors and assigns:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Greenville Township, situate on the western side of Reeves Avenue and being shown and designated as Lot 41 on plat recorded in Plat Book Q at Page 59, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the western side of Reeves Avenue at the joint front corner of Lots 41 and 42 and running thence with the line of Lot 42 S. 88-45 W. 140 feet to pin; thence S. 1-15 E. 50 feet to pin at corner of Lot 40; thence with the line of Lot 40 N. 48-45 E. 140 feet to pin on Reeves Avenue; thence with the western side of Reeves Avenue N. 1-15 W. 50 feet to the point of beginning.

Said premises having been conveyed to the mortgagors by deed recorded in Deed Book 437 at Page 273.
