all that tract or lot of land in

in the City of Greenville, on the South side of Hampton Avenue, and
beginning at a point on said Avenue, seventy-six feet and six inches
from the East side of Hudson Street; thence in a straight line, one
hundred and fifty feet to a point on the North side of a fifteen-foot
alley, sixty-three feet and six inches from the East side of Hudson
Street; thence along said alley in an Easterly direction, and parallel
with Hampton Avenue, fifty-eight feet and six inches to a stake; thence
in a straight line 150 feet to a point on the South side of Hampton
