WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purpose, including advances made by the Mortgagee on other or no security:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN. That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagor at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagoe, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagoe at and before the scaling and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagoe, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in ParisMountain Township, about nine miles north of the City of Greenville, on the Old Little Texas Road, containing 10.69 acres, and being more particularly described according to a survey and plat prepared by Piedmont Engin eeping Service, dated November 22, 1952, as follows:

"BEGINNING at a stone at the fork of Hillhouse Creek, on the Old Little Texas Road, and running thence with the creek the following courses and distances: S. 87-45 W. 66 feet; S. 62-15 W. 330 feet; S. 55-45 W. 252.1 feet; thence leaving the creek and running N. 19-15 E. 957 feet to a stone corner; thence S. 63-15 E. 184.1 feet to a stone corner; thence N. 33 E. 330 feet to a stone corner; thence N. 2 W. 221.8 feet to a stone corner; thence N. 2 W. 221.8 feet to a stone corner; thence S. 68-45 E. 528 feet to an iron pin; thence in a new line, S. 52-14 W. 940.7 feet to a point; thence S. 33-12 W. 163.5 feet to a point; thence S. 20-15 E. 129.8 feet to a point; thence S. 52-20 E. 250.7 feet to a point in center of Old Little Texas Road; thence along center of said Road, S. 55-30 W. 116.3 feet to the beginning corner."
