WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FOUNTAIN INN FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF Fountain Inn, S. C., (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by

reference, in the sum of Six Thousand and 00/100

DOLLARS (\$ 6,000.00), with interest thereon from date at the rate of Six & one-fourth per centum per annum, said principal and interest to be paid as therein stated, and

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does hereby grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns.

All that piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Fairview Township, containing 124 acres, more or less, being comprised of two (2) adjoining tracts of 74 acres and 50 acres, and said tracts being described separately as follows:

NO. I - 74 ACRE TRACT:

Being known as the Polly Nash Place, bounded on the North by W. T. Coleman, now or formerly, on the East by W. E. Chapman, nor or formerly, on the South by W. S. Adair, now or formerly, and on the West by Mrs. Claude Nelson.
