All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, being known and designated as Lot Number 33-B on plat of Morgan Hill Addition, recorded in Plat Book "A" at Page 69 in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County said lot having a frontage of 89 feet on the westerly side of East. Parker Road, a depth of 130 feet on the North, a depth of 174 feet on the south and 75 feet across the rear,

ALSO: ALL that certain piece, parcel or lot of land with all improvements thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, on the southwestern side of the Barker Road (formerly known as Monaghan Road) and on the north side of Morgon Street in a section known as City View, near the City of Greenville, being known as Lot Number 33 and a portion of Lot Number 33-A, on plat of Morgan Hill Addition, made May 15, 1902, recorded in Plat Book A, at page 69 and described as follows:
