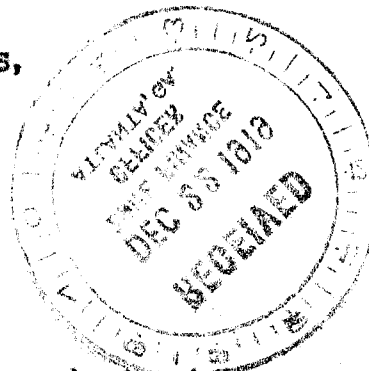

ACCEPTANCE OF AWARD AND RELEASE.

Whereas the War Department Board of Appraisers, by Award No. 1378, dated November 19, 1919, determined that just compensation be made to Noah Cox, Greenville, S.C., Marietta Route, as the former owner of the property described therein, to-wit:

Approximately 22.5 acres of land included in the limits of the artillery range at Camp Sevier, Greenville, S.C., being bounded on the North by a 238 acre tract known as the Mullinax Tract, belonging to the Saluda River Lumber Co., on the East by a 300 acre tract standing in the name of E. L. & Henry Cox, and on the South by 33½ acres of land belonging to R. C. Simpson, being in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

which was damaged by the United States, in the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), the former owner does hereby accept the terms of said award;

And the said former owner, in consideration of the payment to him of the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), does for himself, his heirs, executors or administrators, successors or assigns, hereby forever quit-claim, release and discharge the United States of America of and from all and every claim, demand, action or right of action now existing, or which may hereafter exist on behalf of his heirs, executors or administrators, successors or assigns, for damages arising out of the use and occupation of said property, this release to become effective upon payment of the sum above stated.

Upon consideration of the facts in this claim, acting under authority conferred by General Orders No. 41, War Department, Series 1919, the War Department Board of Appraisers finds that Noah Cox, Greenville, S.C., Marietta Route, was the owner of the following described property:

Approximately 22.5 acres of land included in the limits of the artillery range at Camp Sevier, Greenville, S.C., being bounded on the North by a 238 acre tract known as the Mullinax Tract, belonging to the Saluda River Lumber Co., on the East by a 300 acre tract standing in the name of E. L. & Henry Cox, and on the South by 33 1/4 acres of land belonging to R. C. Simpson, being in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

and that said property was damaged by the United States, during its use and occupancy.

Whereupon this Board awards to Noah Cox, Greenville, S.C., Marietta Route, the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) in full settlement of all claims against the United States for damages arising from the use and occupation of said land by the Government.
