Please *Tarp*... It's the Law.

According to **South Carolina law**,

"no vehicle may be driven or moved on any public highway unless the vehicle is so constructed or loaded to prevent any of its load from dropping, sifting, leaking or otherwise escaping from the vehicle.

"Trucks, trailers, or other vehicles when loaded with rock, gravel, stone, or other similar substances which could blow, leak, sift or drop must not be driven... unless the load is securely covered by tarpaulin or some other suitable covering."

Composting is the natural decay of organic matter in a moist, aerobic, (oxygen-demanding) environment. Tiny organisms break down landscape trimmings and food scraps to create a valuable product called compost - a rich combination of nutrients that can be used to supplement your soil to promote healthy plant growth.

Composting saves tax dollars that would have been spent grinding yard trimmings that are banned from the landfill. Composting saves you money too. You'll no longer need to buy soil additives or enhancers.
